What Does LRE Mean:

- Least Restrictive Environment (LRE): The placement in which an individual student can be taught and make progress in the general education curriculum to the maximum extent possible. The IEP team must consider the continuum of alternative placements and ensure that the needs of students with disabilities are met.
- O Inclusion: Section 1003.57(1)(a)2., Florida Statutes (F.S.) formally defines inclusion. Further, it is the practice of educating all students together (i.e., the students with disabilities and students without disabilities) and students with disabilities are able to access the general curriculum.
- * Least restrictive environment (LRE) isn't a place; it's a principle that guides each exceptional student's educational program.

- The Best Practices in Inclusive Education (BPIE) is an internal assessment required every 3 years in Florida per Section 1003.57(1)(f),F.S.2.
